GREETING:

Whereas, lately in the Court of the United States  
~~for the Circuit Court~~ District of Appeals for the Second Circuit  
~~at some of you,~~ in a cause between The United States, appellant,  
and The Joint Traffic Association et al., appellees,  
wherein the decree of the said United States Circuit  
Court of Appeals, entered in said cause on the  
26<sup>th</sup> day of March, A. D. 1894, is in the following  
words, viz:

"The appeal from the decree of the Circuit  
Court of the United States for the Southern District  
of New York, entered herein on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of June,  
1896, having come on to be heard, and due delibera-  
tion having been had thereon:

Now, on motion of Carter & Ledyard,  
attorneys for the defendants, appellees, it is -

Ordered that the decree aforesaid be, and  
the same hereby is, in all things affirmed; and it is  
further -

Ordered that a mandate issue to the Cir-  
cuit Court of the United States for the Southern District  
of New York directing that Court to proceed in  
accordance herewith."

as by the inspection of the transcript of the record of the said United  
States Circuit Court of Appeals \_\_\_\_\_ of the said \_\_\_\_\_  
Court, which was brought into the Supreme Court of the United States by  
virtue of an appeal \_\_\_\_\_

agreeably to the act of Congress, \_\_\_\_\_  
\_\_\_\_\_ in such case made and provided, fully and at large appears.

And whereas, in the present term of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, the said cause came on to be heard before the said Supreme Court, on the said transcript of record, and was argued by counsel:

On consideration whereof, It is now here ordered \_\_\_\_\_ adjudged and decreed by this Court that the decrees \_\_\_\_\_ of the said \_\_\_\_\_ Court in this cause be, and the same is hereby, \_\_\_\_\_ Circuit Court of the United States for the Southern District of New York and of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit in this cause be, and the same are hereby, reversed.

And it is further ordered that this cause be, and the same is hereby, remanded to the said Circuit Court with directions to take such further proceedings therein as may be in conformity with the opinion of this Court.

October 24, 1898.

You, therefore, are hereby commanded that such ~~execution and~~ further proceedings be had in said cause, in conformity with the opinion and decree of this Court as according to right and justice, and the laws of the United States, ought to be had, the said ~~appeal~~ notwithstanding.
