
Dear Jerry:

I write regarding Micron Technology, Inc. and Micron Semiconductor Products, Inc.'s (collectively, "Micron") cooperation in connection with Oracle's recently filed lawsuit. As you know, Micron applied for and received leniency pursuant to the Department of Justice, Antitrust Division's Corporate Leniency Program.

We look forward to working with you to provide timely and satisfactory cooperation as described in section 213(b)(1), (2), and (3) of the Antitrust Criminal Penalty Enhancement and Reform Act of 2004 ("ACPERA"). As you know, Micron has already cooperated with you in response to previous requests from opt-out plaintiffs represented by your firm in the DRAM antitrust litigation. This cooperation has included providing a full account of all facts known to Micron and furnishing all documents or other items potentially relevant to the civil action that are in Micron's possession, custody, or control. Moreover, Micron has previously used its best efforts to secure and facilitate cooperation from individual Micron employees that are covered by Micron's leniency agreement. Micron has made employees available for interviews requested by you and depositions, and has used its best efforts to ensure that those individuals responded completely and truthfully to your questions.

Although Micron has already provided substantial cooperation, we are willing and available to discuss other cooperation Oracle may request pursuant to ACPERA. We look forward to working with you.

Dear Jerry:

I write in response to your October 27, 2010 letter regarding the additional cooperation that Micron offered to provide to Oracle America, Inc. (formerly Sun Microsystems, Inc. ("Sun")) in my October 10, 2010 letter, pursuant to the Antitrust Criminal Penalty Enhancement and Reform Act ("ACPERA"). Your recitation of prior events is inaccurate and incomplete. Micron has provided substantial cooperation to Sun and other plaintiffs jointly represented by your law firm, including making eight Micron witnesses available for interviews between November 2007 and February 2008, as you acknowledge in your letter. There is no purpose in belaboring the point here, but if necessary in the future we can provide a point-by-point rebuttal to your letter. The relevant point for now is the message of my October 10 letter: Micron remains willing to work with you to provide additional cooperation pursuant to ACPERA in connection with Oracle's suit against Micron. Please let us know if you have any further requests in this regard.


