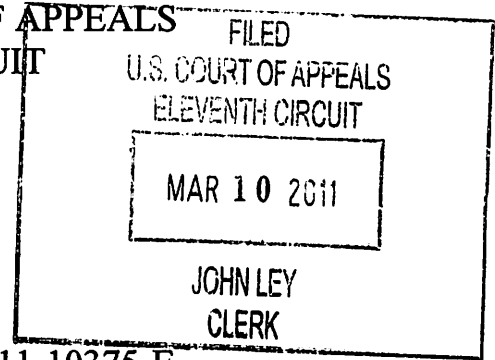

RESPONDENT'S RESPONSE TO JURISDICTIONAL QUESTION

Respondent Federal Trade Commission ("FTC" or "Commission") hereby responds to the jurisdictional question posed by the Court by letter dated March 7, 2011. Section 5(c) of the Federal Trade Commission Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(c), provides that an entity subject to a Commission "cease and desist" order may appeal that order by filing a petition for review in a federal court of appeals "within sixty days from the date of the service of such order." Although the Commission's Final Order that is the subject of this petition for review was dated November 5, 2010, the FTC served that Order on Polypore International, Inc. ("Polypore") on November 29, 2010; therefore, the deadline for filing a petition for review was January 28, 2011. Accordingly, Polypore's petition for review, which it filed in this Court on January 28, 2011, was timely filed.
