several defendants thereto, and argued by counsel by the respective parties and taken under advisement by the Court.

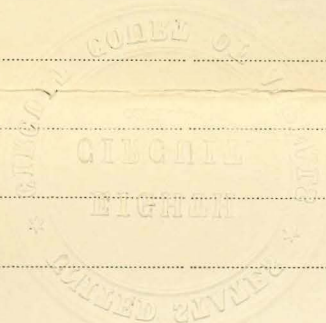
