1 **DEFENDANTS' REVISED JUROR QUESTIONNAIRE**

2 Pursuant to the Court's directive at the November 18, 2011 status conference, Defendants AU
3 Optronics Corporation and AU Optronics Corporation America submit their revised juror questionnaire,
4 which has been substantially narrowed from 65 to 49 questions. Ex. A.

5 **A. Background**

6 On August 23, 2011, Defendants submitted their initial proposed juror questionnaire of 100
7 questions and the government submitted its initial proposed juror questionnaire of 20 questions. Doc.
8 No. 376 (Nedeau Decl., Exs. B, C). The parties met and conferred after the August 26, 2011 status
9 conference, but were unable to reach agreement on the juror questionnaire. Doc. No. 384-1 (Nedeau
10 Decl. ¶¶ 2-6). On September 7, 2011, Defendants submitted their revised juror questionnaire of 65
11 questions and the government submitted its revised juror questionnaire of 36 questions. Doc.
12 Nos. 384-2, 384-3 (Nedeau Decl., Exs. A, B). On October 28, 2011, the parties requested a status
13 conference regarding the juror questionnaire. Doc. No. 405. The status conference was held on
14 November 18, 2011, at which the Court informed Defendants that they could file a revised juror
15 questionnaire by November 23, 2011. Doc. No. 426.

16 **B. Defendants' Revised Juror Questionnaire**

17 Defendants' revised juror questionnaire takes into account the Court's recommendations and is
18 substantially narrowed. Defendants have deleted 16 questions from their prior submission, as well as
19 several subparts from the questions that remain. A large majority of the 49 questions contained on
20 Defendants' current proposal are identical or very similar to those contained in the government's
21 proposed questionnaire, as well as those on the juror questionnaire approved by this Court for use in
22 *United States v. Bonds*. March 15, 2011 Order in *U.S. v. Bonds*, No. 07-CR-0732 (Doc. Nos. 288, 292).
23 Use of Defendants' proposed questionnaire will result in saving the Court, the parties, and the potential
24 jurors the very considerable time that would be required to cover the same issues in voir dire.
