# MARSULEX, INC. AND CHEMTRADE LOGISTICS (U.S.), INC.'S AGREED MOTION FOR A FINDING OF "SATISFACTORY COOPERATION" AND LIMITATION OF DAMAGES PURSUANT TO THE ANTITRUST CRIMINAL PENALTY ENHANCEMENT AND REFORM ACT OF 2004

Defendants Marsulex, Inc. ("Marsulex") and ChemTrade Logistics (U.S.), Inc. ("ChemTrade"), by their attorneys, jointly move pursuant to the Antitrust Criminal Penalty Enhancement and Reform Act of 2004 ("the Act") for a finding of "satisfactory cooperation" and for a limitation of damages as set forth in Sections 213 (a) and (b) of the Act. Plaintiffs' Co-Lead Counsel join this Motion. In support of their motion, Marsulex and ChemTrade state as follows:

1. As described more fully in the accompanying Memorandum of Law, the Act provides that where an "antitrust leniency applicant" (i.e. one who has entered into an "antitrust leniency agreement" with the U.S. Department of Justice) provides "satisfactory cooperation" to civil antitrust plaintiffs, the damages recoverable against such applicant shall be limited to actual damages attributable to the applicant's alleged wrongful conduct (i.e. no treble damages and no joint and several liability).

As described more fully in the accompanying Memorandum of Law, 2.

Marsulex and ChemTrade have met all of the conditions and requirements of the Act, and thus

are entitled to a finding of satisfactory cooperation and a limitation of damages in this action.

Plaintiffs join in this motion because (a) Marsulex and ChemTrade have 3.

thus far provided satisfactory cooperation to Plaintiffs under the Act, and (b) Marsulex and

ChemTrade have agreed to continue to provide satisfactory cooperation to Plaintiffs through the

remainder of this litigation.

WHEREFORE, Marsulex and ChemTrade respectfully request that this Court

enter an Order, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A: (i) finding that Marsulex and

ChemTrade have provided Plaintiffs with "satisfactory cooperation" under Section 213(b) of the

Act, and (ii) pursuant to Section 213(a) of the Act, limiting the damages recoverable by Plaintiffs

against Marsulex and ChemTrade in this action to the "actual damages sustained" by Plaintiffs, if

any, "attributable to" Marsulex's and ChemTrade's alleged wrongful conduct, so that Marsulex

and ChemTrade are not subject to treble damages or joint and several liability.


