CAUSE

The offender has completed 12 months of supervision. He has made a successful reintegration into the community by maintaining a stable residence and employment. He has made progressive strides toward supervision objectives and is in compliance with all the conditions of supervision. He has satisfied the court-ordered financial obligations by paying his \$200 assessment and \$5,000 fine. In the instant offense, he did not participate in an aggravating role, and has no history of violence. He has not been involved in any criminal conduct during the term of supervision, and there is no evidence of illegal drug or alcohol use. There does not appear to be a risk to the safety of any identifiable victim or to the public in general.

Title 18 U.S.C. §§ 3564(c) and 3583(e)(1) permit the Court to terminate terms of probation in misdemeanor cases at any time and terms of supervised release or probation in felony cases after expiration of one year of supervision if satisfied that such action is warranted by the conduct of the offender and in the interest of justice.

Considering the above information, this officer recommends the offender's term of supervised release be terminated effective immediately, rather than the scheduled expiration date of March 12, 2011.
