The Court having reviewed Plaintiff Axon Enterprise, Inc.’s (“Axon”) Motion for Preliminary Injunction (Doc. __), and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Motion is GRANTED.

Plaintiff has demonstrated that this Court has subject matter jurisdiction over the constitutional claims set forth in Axon’s Complaint at Counts I and II pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1331, that it is likely to succeed on the merits of its claims, that it will suffer irreparable harm if the preliminary injunction is not granted, that the balance of equities weighs in favor of an injunction, and that a preliminary injunction would serve the public interest.

Defendants Federal Trade Commission and Commissioners, including their various agents, employees and attorneys, are hereby enjoined from pursuing any administrative action against Plaintiff concerning the Axon/Viewu merger, and the administrative proceeding captioned *In the Matter of Axon/Viewu*, FTC Matter No. 1810162 (Docket No. 9389) is hereby stayed, pending the resolution in this Court on the merits of Counts I and II of Axon’s Complaint.

This preliminary injunction shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect until further order of this Court.
