**ORDER**

On July 23, 2024, Defendant Tempur Sealy International filed a Motion to Seal Information in the Answer. *See* ECF No. 53. Therein, Tempur Sealy has asked to seal a small amount of information in its Answer.

The Court has considered the arguments and has conducted a line-by-line review of the information sought to be redacted. The Court concludes that the information sought to be redacted is confidential and competitively sensitive and would harm Defendants and third parties if revealed publicly. The Court further finds that the redactions are narrowly tailored to Defendants' legitimate business interest and that this case is still at an early stage. Accordingly, it concludes that the Defendants' interest in keeping confidential competitively sensitive information outweighs the public's interest.

The Court therefore GRANTS Defendants' Motion and ORDERS that the unredacted Answer (ECF No. 52) be kept under seal.
