STIPULATED SCHEDULING ORDER

AND NOW, this 17th day of April, 2020, following a conference with counsel for the parties, it is **ORDERED** that:

- 1. Fact discovery shall be completed by **July 20, 2020**.
- 2. Plaintiffs shall produce their expert report(s) by **July 23, 2020**.

Defendants shall produce their expert report(s) by **August 10, 2020**. Plaintiffs shall produce their rebuttal expert report(s) by **August 20, 2020**. All expert discovery, including expert depositions, shall be completed by **August 28, 2020**.

3. Plaintiffs and Defendants shall file their pre-hearing memoranda by

September 2, 2020. Each side's memorandum shall be limited to twenty-five (25) pages.

4. All motions *in limine*, including *Daubert* motions, shall be filed on or before **September 2, 2020**. Responses to any such motions shall be filed on or before **September 8, 2020**.

5. A final pre-hearing conference and oral argument on the motions *in limine* (if necessary) will be held on **September 10, 2020, at 10:00 a.m**. At the final pre-hearing conference, counsel shall be prepared to discuss all aspects of their prehearing memoranda. It is expected that counsel will have conferred regarding their objections to anything in the pre-hearing memoranda prior to the final pre-hearing conference, leaving for the Court only those objections the parties could not resolve.

6. The evidentiary hearing on Plaintiffs' motion for a preliminary injunction shall begin on **September 14, 2020**.

7. Plaintiffs and Defendants shall submit their proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law by **September 28, 2020**, or ten days after the hearing ends. Each side's proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law shall be limited to fifty (50) pages.
